### Genesis 50

### **INTRODUCTION:**

- 1. VERY IMPORTANT: Only those who can see sin the way God sees sin are willing to sacrifice, to cover it and forgive and be forgiven.
- 2. THAT MEANS: Only those who have experienced forgiveness understand how to forgive.
- 3. INTIMACY WITH GOD and day to day purity of heart is dependent on our forgiveness of others.
  - a) Matthew 6:12
- 4. Our **FORGIVENESS** of others is to be a picture of God's FORGIVENESS of us.
  - a) Matthew 18:22
    - 1) Means there is no measure of Forgiveness.
  - b) Ephesians 4:32
  - c) Colossians 3:13
- 5. FORGIVENESS has to do with a BROKEN RELATIONSHIP.
- 6. GOOD: There is a price however for our UNFORGIVENESS.
  - a) UNFORGIVENESS produces hatred, animosity, bitterness, anger and (retribution) which is retaliation.
- 7. UNFORGIVENESS allows anger to rage out of control and negative emotions run unchecked.
  - a) On the other HAND forgiveness FREES people from their past.
  - b) FORGIVENESS frees the soul, relieves tension, and brings peace and Joy as well as healing to relationships.
- 8. QUESTION: Does God ever withhold FORGIVENESS? YES
- 9. **DEFINITION OF FORGIVENESS**: The Greek word for FORGIVENESS means to "Hurl or send it away".
  - a) What do I do if the OFFENDER doesn't ask for forgiveness? What if they act like it's NOTHING?
  - b) "What do I do with my hurt?"
    - 1) 1 Peter 5:6-8
      - a) "cast" means to hurl

- b) "anxieties" (KJV cares) means distractions.
- 2) Micah 7:19
- 3) Isaiah 1:18
- 4) Psalm 103:12
- 10. It is extremely important to understand that the **TRUE FORGIVENESS** God extends to us is **CONDITIONAL**.
  - a) Luke 23:33-34
- 11. God has done everything possible to facilitate forgiveness.
  - a) 2 Peter 3:9
- 12. Because our **FORGIVENESS** is analogous to God's we are to forgive as we have been forgiven.
  - a) Ephesians 4:32
  - b) Mark 11:25-26
- 13. Be real careful the standard by which you set for forgiveness.
  - a) Matthew 7:1-3
- 14. FORGIVENESS is an OBLIGATION and a DELIGHT.
- 15. Genesis 49:28-33, 50:1-14
- 16. Genesis 50:15
  - 1) "evil" pre-meditated harm. And they knew it.
  - 2) Cf. Genesis 37:12-14; 18-20

### TWO THINGS FORGIVENESS INVOLVES

## I. A REALISTIC UNDERSTANDING OF SIN

- 1. Vs 19
  - a) "Do not fear"
- 2. Vs 20

### A. HOW TO REPENT

- 1. But before **FORGIVENESS** can take place, the **OFFENDER** and the **OFFENDED** must have a realistic understanding of sin.
  - a) If not there can be no repentance and no release of guilt.

- 2. Vs 20
  - a) "you meant evil against me"
    - 1) Your sin against me was pre-meditated, deliberate, and intentional.
    - 2) It was pure unadulterated evil.
- 3. On the other hand I have met people who want to make people squirm who have truly repented.
  - a) And that is evil in itself.

## II. A REALISTIC UNDERSTANDING OF GOD'S CONTROL

- 1. Vs 20b
  - a) "but God meant if for good."
- 2. Cf. Romans 8:28
- 3. Joseph's life is a realistic appreciation for the sovereignty of God and that things aren't as bad as they seem.
- 4. Vs 20c
  - a) "to bring it about that many people should be kept alive"
- 5. Cf 48:8-9
  - a) "that God has given me here"
- 6. Genesis 50:21
- A. DON'T PLAY GOD
  - 1. Vs 19b
    - a) "for I am in the place of God."
  - 2. Romans 12:19

### B. GOD'S ROLE IN OUR LIVES

- 1. Have you ever been at the mercy of a tormentor for an extended period of time?
  - a) Someone who wants to hurt you?
- 2. That's when we "Cast our cares upon Him"
  - a) Vengeance is mine I will repay saith the Lord.

  - a) But his willingness to forgive was wrapped up in compassion.
